Nationwide Programs

AUDIANT ALLIANCE is a nationwide program that helps those in need obtain hearing aids at a reduced cost. Candidates are qualified for the program based on their annual household income. More hearing aid assistance

Contact your local Lion's Club by phone or email and ask about the Affordable Hearing Aid Program (AHAP). This is a program that the Lions offer to low income or uninsured persons who cannot afford a hearing aid but are in dire need of one. There are a few sheets of paper that must be filled out, and a few sheets your physician has to fill out. But when given back to the Lion's Club, they vote on helping or not and in turn you have the opportunity to choose the type of hearing aid you want from a list of ones they offer to pay for. Contact your local Sertoma Club by phone or email to inquire about the SHARPS program. They offer help in obtaining hearing aids at no cost to you if you meet certain criteria.
